## WHAT'S ON THE BALLOT?

**Tuesday, November 5th** is the last day to cast your vote. This November, you will be voting for numerous propositions, measures, and elected officials. If you live in Redwood City, East Palo Alto, Menlo Park, and North Fair Oaks, you will also be voting for your County District Supervisor. **If you live in East Palo Alto, don't forget to vote for:**

### MEASURE JJ

**What is it?** An Amendment to the current 2.5% Parcel Tax Law so funds are dedicated to affordable housing-related purposes rather than general use. Funds would cover tenant rental assistance and tax administration costs, with remaining funds used for helping people purchase affordable homes, maintaining housing affordability, assisting renters, and preventing homelessness within the city.

**A “Yes” vote supports** allocating funds to tenant rental assistance, other affordable housing purposes, and expenses to cover the costs of administering the tax.

**A “No” vote means** that the current funds may continue to be used by the City Council for any purpose that benefits residents.
